There have been lots of changes at Settle Pool in the year since we re-opened following major redevelopment work.



TASH WARD IS NEW CENTRE MANAGER



Tash Ward was appointed as Centre Manager at Settle Area Swimming Pool earlier this year.

This new role brings together responsibility for the whole building including both the pool itself and the new fitSpace area which was created following last year's major re-development.

Tash had been acting as interim manager since May. She joined the pool team in August last year, initially in the role of business development manager.

The creation of the new post is part of wider changes to the staffing structure to reflect the major developments at the pool and the new opportunities for use of the facilities.

Formerly club manager of Anytime Fitness in Ilkley, Tash has a sports management degree

from Leeds Beckett University. She is also a qualified fitness instructor and personal trainer.

Growing up in Thailand and going to an International School, Tash was involved in a variety of sports from an early age. She was particularly attracted to karate, becoming a black belt and world champion at the age of 14.

In September 2020 Tash and her partner moved to Settle. They have a baby boy now nearing two years old.

Tash said: "Over the past year I have come to appreciate just how much the people of this area love their pool. It is the support given by the staff, the customers, the trustees and the multitude of volunteers who work tirelessly to raise funds that keeps the pool going.

"We now have great facilities. The challenge is to make the best use of them for the benefit of the whole community. We made a great start this summer with our intensive swimming classes. And I am delighted to see the building is being used by people of all ages and abilities. But there is more that needs to be done to reach out to the whole community and to make sure that people know there is something for everyone here at Settle pool."

Aaron Guy joined the pool team this summer and immediately revamped our range of fitness classes.

Aaron writes: "I am excited to be working at Settle Pool. I joined the pool in early August and currently reside in Clitheroe. With 10 years of experience in the leisure industry and six years of management expertise, I bring my knowledge to my new role. OUR AMAZING POP UP SHOP

Our new pop-up shop in the centre of Settle opened at the start of October.

You can find it next to the Royal Oak, in the former framing shop. The new premises, which are operating alongside the existing shop in nearby Duke Street, will be used for the sale of larger items – mainly worth more than £5.

We needed the new shop to show the many generous and exciting donations that our supporters have brought to the containers in the pool carpark on Tuesday and Friday mornings.

To date many of the items that cannot be accommodated in the Duke Street shop have been sold on line. But as time has gone on our 'on-line sales team' of Jean Lonsdale and Heather Collins have been stretched to the limit, as has space in the containers, hence the need for new premises to show off the amazing donations.

Initially the shop will open on Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays for a six month period. But where we go from there depends on how successful our new venture proves to be. But you can be sure of two things:you will be getting bargains and whatever we make will help keep the pool afloat.



MEET THE NEW TRUSTEES

Over the past few months we have said farewell to some of the trustees who have helped us through the major redevelopment work over the past few years and welcomed new trustees to help shape our future direction.

In addition to the departure of former chair Pat Taylor, and building expert Bryan Atkinson earlier in the year, Kath Mason stepped down this summer, though Kath continues to help with the publicity group and works at the container on Tuesday mornings.

Cynthia Moorhead joined the trustees earlier in the year and is playing a big role in helping Anne Galloway on staff liaison. She has now been joined by Elaine Owen whose valuable experience in the insurance business is proving a real boon for the pool and more recently Helen Brocklehurst has become our newest trustee.

Settle went flowerpotty last summer as the town's popular flowerpot festival celebrated its tenth anniversary with more flowerpot creations than ever before.

The pool played its part with our flowerpot swimmer in the pool foyer and an octopus in the Duke Street shop window.
