THE POOL IS ON THE MOVE

Just a few months after completion of the major redevelopment work, things are back in full swing at Settle Pool.

Not only is the pool in use seven days a week, for up to 14 hours on two days, but we are also developing new and exciting sessions in fitSpace, the multiuse dry area that has added a whole new dimension to our facilities.

In the pool, the arrival a new inflatable early in the new year (see above) has meant that the popular weekend fun sessions could resume. School swimming, which has long been the core of the pool's contribution to the local community, now occupies the water for up to 13 hours a week. For the early risers we have lane swimming from 6.30am twice a week and for the not-so-early risers gentle exercise later in the day.

The new spin classes (static cycling) are proving extremely popular and so too are the soft play sessions for toddlers. And before, after, or perhaps even instead of the healthy exercise you can enjoy a relaxing hot drink in our new café.

Spin around the clock with Freda's and the pool



On Saturday March 18 the pool is joining forces with near neighbours Freda's Nursery in a 12-hour fund-raising marathon that will see three hardy cyclists pedaling static cycles from 5am through to 5pm.

The event takes place in the pool's fitSpace centre and the money raised will go towards the rebuild programme for the nursery as well as helping with the pool's continuing need for funding.

The three cyclists are: local mum Jo Ward, nursery worker Anita Eccleston and former pool worker Kate Dinsdale (see photo page 1).

Supporters who want to back the spinathon trio in a more visible way can spin alongside the three in one hour time slots in return for a minimum sponsorship of £20. Easyfunding

Did you know the pool is now registered with easyfunding? This means that when supporters buy on line their retailer will make a donation to the pool.

There are more than 3,000 shops and sites on board including Amazon, Argos, Boots, Tesco and Marks and Spencer and within days of joining the money had started to come in.

WANTED: NEW TRUSTEES

Could you jump in and help us run the pool?

Settle Pool is run as a charity –a Charitable Incorporated Organisation to be precise. That means overall responsibility for running the pool rests with a group of local people who act as trustees. The dozen or so work with the manager, staff and the volunteers who support the pool in many different ways.

Over the past few years the trustees have overseen the biggest redevelopment in the pool's fifty year history. We now have exciting new facilities alongside the pool itself. After seeing

through this project some of the trustees are moving on.

Pat Taylor, who as chair of the trustees from 2016 played a major role the redevelopment stepped down in December and Bryan Atkinson, whose knowledge of the building industry has proved crucial over the past two years is due to go in April.

We have been joined by long-time pool supporter and volunteer Cynthia Moorhead but we are still looking for other trustees to boost our numbers and bring in fresh thinking.

We need people who are strongly committed to the pool and are willing to work with others to build on what has been achieved to date.

The trustees currently meet formally for about two hours ten times a year but all devote a lot more time to fulfilling their role outside meetings.

Much of the work is now done through four groups: finance, facilities, human resources and publicity and marketing. Ideally new trustees would bring some degree of expertise and experience in at least one of these areas. But more important they must be prepared to ensure that we carry out our charitable purpose; comply with our constitution; act in the best interests of the charity and the public; and act with reasonable care and skill.

The job of trustee is unpaid though reasonable out-of-pocket expenses will be met.

You should also note that our status as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation means trustees do not bear any personal financial responsibility in the unlikely event of the pool going into debt.
