## A new Health and Wellbeing Hub at Settle Pool

For 45 years the people of Settle and the surrounding communities have enjoyed the indoor swimming facilities provided by Settle Pool. Now, in the biggest development since the opening of the pool in 1974, we are planning a major extension to the building so that it becomes not just a swimming pool, but a new Health and Wellbeing hub, combining new dry side facilities including a studio/meeting/ social event space and many other facilities, alongside the pool.

The changing facilities will be brought up to date with a changing village to meet the needs of all users. There will be a larger and improved reception area with a café space linked to the studio to provide maximum flexibility. The new facilities will offer a wide range of activities for community use. Plans for the Health and Wellbeing Hub, which you can see on page 3 of this newsletter, have now been submitted to Craven District Council and we hope to start the rebuild early in 2021. This is only the first announcement of many - there will be more publicity about the new work as we move forward.

There is of course a financial cost to all this. Thanks to reserves built up by pool trustees and by the Friends of Settle Swimming Pool, and also grants from Craven DC and from a major national body, we are now in a strong position to go ahead. Just as the Settle Community has been part of the story of the pool over our first 45 years we will be looking for your support to continue as we move forward with this exciting new venture.

## The pool garden gets a makeover

Visitors to the pool have in recent years passed a rather shabby traffic island which started life as a flower bed but had become home to a collection of rubble, drinks cans and tyre tracks. Until, that is, it came to the attention of Giggleswick Women's Institute.

Giggleswick resident and WI member, Dora Tattersall, decided that something had to be done about it. WI members agreed to invest some money and a great deal of energy in bringing the flower bed back to something of which the parish could be proud — rather like the pool itself. With permission from NYCC, working parties have transformed the space. Most of the new bulbs, plants and shrubs came from WI members' gardens and some purchased with support from Lay of the Land — thank you.
